About four years ago I came across this fly courtesy of a friend who told me that it was very useful at 'pin-fry' time.

I duly tied a few then, as ever, forgot about it.....

That was until two years ago, when I was fishing at Bewl Water for a few days, the trout appeared to be extremely preoccupied, and then I managed a few fish on this pattern.

Over the past two years, when the trout are going through this phase of fry bashing, this pattern has proved very useful, especially when used with a long fluorocarbon leader. Cast into the area of activity and do nothing - the line will tighten as the fly drops through the water.....

| Thread | : | Black |
| Body | : | Flat pearl tinsel |
| Wing | : | A small bunch of Grizzle hackle fibres |
| Head | : | Built up - not too big - with painted eyes |
